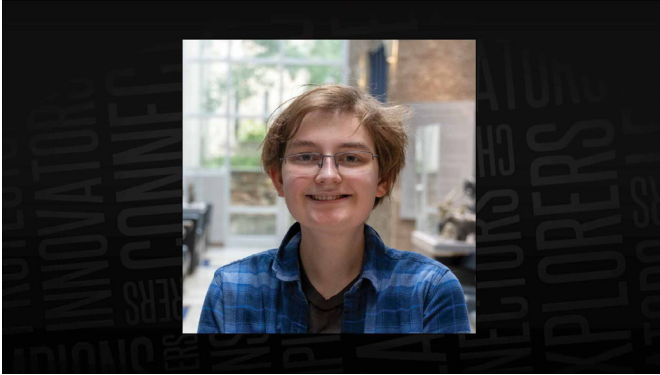

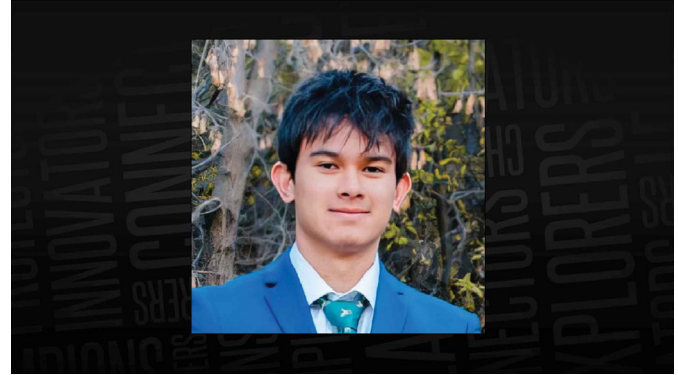

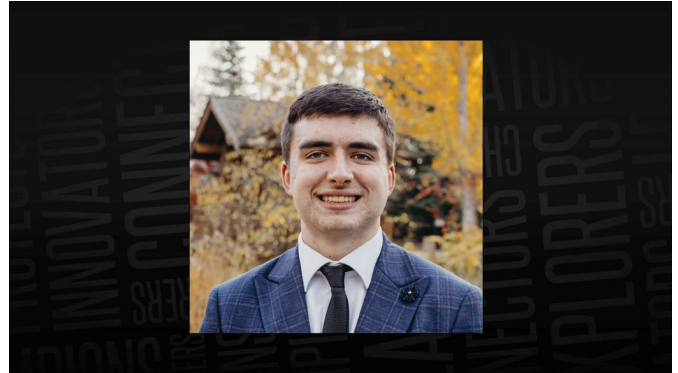

SUPPORTING STUDENTS IN CRITICAL TIMES

Last year, 25 international students from 17 different countries impacted by conflict and unrest were supported through the **Students at Risk Fund**.

The **Nasser Family Emergency Student Trust** also provided crucial support to students across our campuses. In total, more than \$55,000 was distributed to aid 65 students in crisis.
